Objective


- Research staff from the Baltimore Education Research Consortium (BERC) and the City Schools Office of Achievement and Accountability (A&A) prepared a summary of college enrollment outcomes based on National Student Clearinghouse data (supplemented by comparable data from Morgan State University) for the High School Classes of 2008 and 2009.
- For the enrollment for Classes of 2008 and 2009, we suggest the results are useful as baseline measures against which future goals might be set.

City Schools High School Graduating Classes*


Class of 2008, N=4017


What Percent of Each High School Graduating Class Enrolled in College the Fall Following High School Graduation?**




Among Those Enrolling in the Fall Following High School Graduation, What Percent Enrolled in 4-Year and 2-Year Colleges?**
